MESSAGE FROM THE COURSE DIRECTORS

The GHAPP conference is the only conference specifically designed by advanced practice providers (APPs) for the purpose of meeting the educational needs of APPs who specialize in the management of patients with GI disorders and chronic liver disease. APPs, also known as nurse practitioners and physician assistants, have become important members of the care team in today's healthcare environment. With an aging US population and the growing shortage of physicians, APPs play a key role in the health care and management of patients with chronic illnesses. COURSE OVERVIEW

The objective of the 2022 GHAPP conference is to bring together APPs for an in-depth clinical update, to foster an interactive discussion on the latest scientific and clinical developments, and to review important current concepts in the multidisciplinary treatment of patients with GI disorders and chronic liver disease. - The majority of NPs (57.4%) see three or more patients per hour.³
- By 2026, the Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that the NP role will have **grown by 36% compared to 13%** for physicians (this excludes anesthesiologists and surgeons).⁴
